
Working Bee








PE News

STEM News

This week in STEM, the 4-6's continued their unit on Space. Their task was to develop an engaging poster describing the planet of their choice to hang up in our STEM room. The students worked particularly well in this session, allowing them to be creative and demonstrate their understandings in their own individual ways. Great work 4-6's!







In Grade 1, the students continued to learn about Day and Night, focusing on the moon and its phases. The students were able to identify 4 types of moon phases, being Crescent, Half, Gibbous and Full. The students demonstrated their understandings using chalk on the asphalt area of the school. They had heaps of fun!!

In Grade 2-3, the students continued to develop their understanding of sustainability. We focused on the three R's, Reduce, Reuse, Recycle, and the students were able to make meaningful connections to how they can perform the three R's in their daily lives to decrease our carbon footprint.
