From the Principal

I hope this message finds you in good spirits and surviving the chaos of school drop-offs including navigating the trek to our new building. Can you believe we've already conquered the first full week of the school year? Time flies when you're having fun!

Thank you to our parents who attended our information session. The session was designed to provide information from a whole school perspective as well as class based information and an opportunity to meet classroom teachers.

The main elements covered from a whole school perspective:

- BWPS is a School-Wide Positive Behaviour Support (SWPBS) School. Staff have worked to update the Matrix for 2024 and we will meet with Student Leaders to get their feedback. The Matrix will be sent home to all families for a consistent use of language in regards to expected behaviours at BWPS.
- We are working towards filling all the leaves on our tree for a whole school reward. Each class is also working towards a whole class reward for filling either 1,2 or 3 tubes. Class rewards are determined by students.
- We are adding 2 new awards to our assemblies on a Friday. Coming soon each
 class will present a Value award to a student demonstrating Being Respectful,
 Being Safe or Being a Learner, linked to SWPBS Matrix, there will also be a
 Specialist award from PE, Art, Auslan or STEM.
- BWPS will transition to using only Compass as the method for all communication, updates, permission forms and payments, paper copies will no longer be send home.. We will use term one to iron out any issues for families. Please let Leonie know if you are having issues logging into Compass.
- Student Information Packs will be sent home next week and they include information to update details, a local permission form for local excursions and photo permission forms. These will be in paper copy this year so keep an eye out.
- Student Support Group (SSG) meetings will be held for a number of students next week. Your class teacher will be contact you if your child requires an SSG Meeting.
- Homework expectation at BWPS for all students is to read 5 times a week. For
 most students they will need to read to an adult and fill in their reading log
 books. There is no other expectation for homework to be done.

- 12:50—1: 50pm—in class learning time
- 1:50pm—2:30pm—Lunch Play
- 2:30 pm—3:30pm—in class learning time.

As you can see our recess and lunch time break times have not changed we have simply moved our lunch eating time.

Our students spoke about how they show leadership and learnt how leadership now can help develop skills that they will use throughout their lives.


The session finished with our students sharing with Jackson their career aspirations.

We thank Jackson Taylor for making time to visit our school and meet our 2024 Student Leadership Team.


